## GETTING THERE

Haarlem, located 20 km west of Amsterdam, is easily accessible by various modes of transport.



- Amsterdam Schiphol (AMS) is the nearest airport
- 20-minute train ride from Schiphol to Haarlem



- Frequent services from Amsterdam (15 minutes), The Hague (35 minutes), and Rotterdam (45 minutes)



- Accessible via the A9 motorway
- Multiple parking garages are available in the city center

## GETTING AROUND

Haarlem is compact and perfect for exploring on foot or by bike.

### WALKING

- Most attractions are within a short stroll from each other

### CYCLING

- Rent a bike from places like Rent a Bike Haarlem

### PUBLIC TRANSPORT

- Efficient bus network by Connexxion.

### TAXI & UBER

- Available but can be expensive; useful for late-night returns.

- **Grote Markt** – Bustling heart of Haarlem
- **Corrie ten Boom House Museum** – Dedicated to WWII efforts
- **Haarlemmerhout** – Large park with a petting zoo and deer park

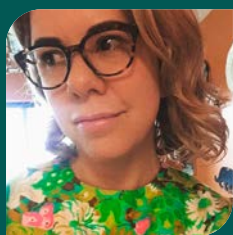

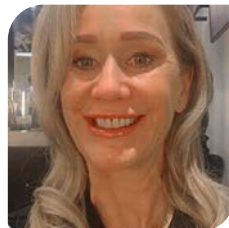
